

Autumn Beasties

In our area, harvest mites (berry bugs) are very prevalent and these make many of our pets itchy, resulting in sores from licking and scratching. These pets need treatment to stop the self-harming that goes on. Often the cause of millitary exema in cats and itchy red abdomens, legs and feet in dogs. These mites are tiny and look like an orange-coloured dot, often seen on the web between the toes. They bite to feed and this sets off the allergy in some individuals
 Fleas and ticks have been multiplying all year and become even more common until a cold spell comes along, usually in November. Keep your treatments and preventions going at this time of year. We see more flea infestations now than at any other time of year. Mainly because people think a pets OK because it's slightly colder. Ticks are also still active until the weather becomes much colder. Better to prevent than treat!
